CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



Just recently the XIIth CCTM Executive Meeting was successfully concluded from 21 – 25 September and with it concludes our last CCTM Executive Meeting as a 2nd batch of CCTM Executive Board Members. The 13th CCTM Executive Members Meeting will be held next year after the reinstatement of 3rd CCTM Executive Board Members through election process in March 2010. I would like to highlight the two main issues concerning Tibetan Medicine in this year of Earth-Ox.

Firstly, in order to achieve legal recognition of Tibetan Sowa Rigpa by the Govt of India, after a repeated discussions among experts and investigations over a year by the special investigating team set up under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt of India, CCTM finally received their report in March this year titled “Recognition of Sowa Rigpa”. In nutshell, though there was no direct reference on Sowa Rigpa as being Tibetan Medicine, or as a part of unique Tibetan Traditional System of Medicine, but in the section of Sowa Rigpa’s origination, it underscores the point that Sowa Rigpa, comprises of Gyud-shi was practised in ancient Tibet from the times of Shang-shung Bon and to the Great Dharma Kings of Tibet. The report also mentions Sowa Rigpa as an ancient medical system long practiced in the Trans-Himalayan regions as Amchi System of Medicine and later flourished to Tibet, Mongolia and Central Asia, and now, is soon going to be legally recognized by the Govt of India.

Press Bureau of India and few other newspapers reported that Indian cabinet has already given approval of the recognition of Sowa Rigpa via amendment of the bye-laws of the Indian Medical Council and shall then be put up before the Indian Parliament in November 2009 for the final amendment of the constitution paving the way for legal recognition of Sowa Rigpa by Govt of India. This has raised suspicion and a bit of anxiety among our Tibetan doctors whose points of argument is that Sowa Rigpa is not going to be recognized as Tibetan Sowa Rigpa or Tibetan

Medicine, but, rather as a Himalayan Medicine or as an Indian system of Medicine as some newspaper has pointed. They are obviously worried about the consequences as to the real status of Tibetan Medicine. CCTM in turn, has tried through many channels to explain the situation and has also written to several high office of immediate concern to apprise the gravity of the situation. The bottom line is that we have made it amply clear as to the fact that, even though if it is not stated directly as Tibetan Medicine in the final report, but as a Tibetan saying, “The origin of water should touch the snow””, likewise, the recognition of Sowa Rigpa should point towards as being that of Traditional Tibetan Medical System, and its origin and historical evidence of Sowa Rigpa with rGyud-bzhi as its main subject should be traced and recognized as an integral part of cultural heritage of Tibet and its people.

Secondly, 7th International Conference on Traditional Asian Medicine was held in Thimbu, Bhutan from 7 – 11th September with over 250 delegates and experts from 34 different countries including about 20 Tibetan physicians from Tibet part of Yunan and Siling. From Tibetan exiled communities, two representatives from CCTM, two from Mentsee-khang and 5 young doctors from Central Institute of Higher Tibetan University, Varanasi have attended the Conference. Although there were many experts from the field of various Asian System of Medicines including Ayurveda, Chinese Medicine, Tibetan Sowa Rigpa, Kempo and others to name few who delivered talks on their respective system of medicine, however I take pride in informing that there was special aura of attention and interest from the general participants for the Traditional Tibetan Medicine which has taken the central stage. Unlike other International Conferences, this Conference has devoted a special section for the TMS and its practitioners where the talks were conducted in Tibetan language. This has helped the Tibetan doctors from Tibet and doctors from Nepal practicing Sorig Bum-bzhi or Shang-shun Bon Medicine System. In my capacity as a chairman of CCTM, I had the opportunity to delivering two talks: Legalization of Tibetan Medicine under CCTM, and Clinical research into the efficacy of Tibetan Medicine against Cancer both of which was well received and appreciated.

In a nutshell, although the working term of the 2nd CCTM Executive Board Members ends by 5th January 2010, it was postponed till March 2010 because of the congregation of Tibetan doctors both from India and abroad for the 2nd National Conference on Tibetan Medicine and with a view of expecting more doctors for the election of 3rd CCTM executive board members. Four-day 2nd National Conference on Tibetan Medicine will be organized jointly by CCTM and Mentsee-Khang in March 2010 in Dharamsala. At the best, we are looking at the possibility of inviting His Holiness the Dalai Lama for the inaugural function of the conference.

As per the resolution passed earlier by CCTM executive members, a special Sorig Award Committee was formed to honour the distinguished Tibetan Medicine Practitioner, once every 3 years time, with an award titled “**Yuthog Award**” for his/ her lifetime dedication and special contribution towards enrichment and promotion Tibetan Medicine. We hope to confer the first of this prestigious award during the forthcoming Conference.

Lastly, on behalf of all the executive members and working staff members of CCTM, I would like to extend our deep sense of gratitude and Thank you to all the related organizations, dedicated financial contributors and sponsors and well wishers, and to all our doctors and health practitioners registered under CCTM for their unwavering and continued support for the smooth running and success of our various activities. “May Sowa Rigpa’s lineage prevail”.

12th Executive Meeting of Central Council of Tibetan Medicine (CCTM)

The 12th Executive Meeting of the Central Council of Tibetan Medicine (CCTM) was held from September 21 – 25, 2009 in the CCTM Office, Dharamsala. Morning session of the first day of the Meeting, in presence of Honorable Health Minister, Health Secretary and the Personal Assistant to Health Minister, Department of Health (CTA), CCTM General Secretary introduced the CCTM executive members and the office staff, thereafter CCTM Chairman presented the CCTM Annual Report and future projects and activities of CCTM. After that



Honorable Health Minister emphasized the need of CCTM being apex body of all Tibetan medical institutions and establishments. He also expressed his deep sense of appreciations to CCTM having successfully organized Youthog- Nyingthig Wang-Loong to all the Tibetan Medical Practitioners. He further gave his kind thoughts and suggestions in undertaking CCTM future projects and activities.

Finalization of Important Matters & Resolutions Reached during the Meeting

After receiving opinions and suggestions from the concerned Tibetan medical experts in two occasions with regard to Kachupa syllabus and Pharmaceutical rules and regulations, CCTM members during the meet have worked diligently in reviewing, verifying and eventually have finalized the two drafts.

On the third day of the meeting, CCTM executive members discussed on conferring awards to distinguish personal in recognition of their remarkable achievement towards preservation and promotion of Tibetan Medicine. An award committee comprising of 5 members with CCTM representative as the head was formed under CCTM with representative from all the recognized medical college and institutions including Bon tradition. The committee will be responsible for preparing rules and regulations, assigning name of the award and pre-selection of suitable candidates for the Awards. The final selection of candidate for the awards rests with the CCTM Executive members.

CCTM and MTK have long been planning to organize an International Conference of Tibetan Medicine in March 2010. During the 4th day of the meeting, CCTM

Executive Members, Director of the TMAI, Dharamsala and the Organizing Committee for the International Conference of Tibetan Medicine that is to be organized jointly by Central Council of Tibetan Medicine (CCTM) and Tibetan Medical & Astro. Institutes (TMAI) Dharamsala in March 2010, have discussed about the upcoming joint-event and reached certain resolutions which have been kept aside.

On the final day of the meeting, deliberation on the need to revise the bye-law, rules and regulation of CCTM were broadly discussed. Following are the unanimous resolution:

1. Under the CCTM bye-law Section 3 of 10th clause read – “Tibetan Medical Doctors, who have been practicing Tibetan Medicine before 1992 can register themselves as a Tibetan Medical Practitioner under CCTM without appearing in any medical tests.” This clause has to be withdrawn.
2. “Those who have completed their medical studies in Tibet and have Menpa Kachupa degree or equivalent can register themselves as a Tibetan Medical Practitioners under CCTM.” This new clause to be added to the CCTM bye-law of Section 3 .

In the afternoon of the final day, the executive members discussed on the financial status of the CCTM and ways and means to raise funds. It was resolved in the meeting to create international awareness about Tibetan medicine, particularly introducing CCTM projects and initiatives and need for funds in undertaking the Council’s projects and activities. It was also resolved to contact and seek assistance from the Offices of Tibet (Representatives) overseas in arranging Tibetan Medical Camps and Experts Talk on Tibetan Medicine as a means to raise funds as well as creating awareness about Tibetan Traditional Medicine.

Since this was the last meeting for the Members of the 2nd CCTM Executive Board, all the Executive Members have wholeheartedly discussed, put forth valuable suggestions and reached certain resolutions for the promotion and betterment of the Council. The five-day meet concluded with a great success.

Recognition of Tibetan Medicine under Indian Legal System – Its Origin and its Present Status

In the year 2005, CCTM has its first proposal sent to the Secretary of AYUSH for recognition of Tibetan Medical System by Govt. of India. That was the first contact between CCTM and AYUSH.

On 27th March 2007, CCTM organized a whole day meeting with head of the concerned ministry of CTA and Representative from Men-Tsee-Khang and discussed issues related to legal recognition of Tibetan Medicine and the use of right terminology. A resolution was passed and henceforth it will be called ‘Tibetan Medicine’ in English, ‘Bhot Chikitsa Vidya’ in Hindi while applying for legal recognition. In the same year, in response to CCTM’s repeated appeal for achieving legal recognition, AYUSH Department constituted a special committee comprising of 6 experts to undertake the needful inspections. The committee carried out several discussions and a formal debate under Geshe Ngawang Samten was held with experts from both Tibetan Medicine and AYUSH and were able to bring out unique characteristics from both the ancient Medical cultures. The members of the committee visited TMAI for on the ground inspections and on 5th May 2008, the team submitted a 424 pages report to the Central Government. CCTM received copy of the report wherein it mentioned recognition of ‘Sowa Rigpa’ and not ‘Tibetan Sowa Rigpa’. Therefore, CCTM brought this to the notice of Kashag (Cabinet) and to Gheshe Ngawang Samten, Chairman of the inspection team for suggestions and clarifications. Since ‘Sowa Rigpa’ had its history and origin related to Tibet and has its documentation proof, it does not really matter when name of the country of its origin (Tibet) is not mentioned.

With regard to the present status of the recognition of Tibetan Medicine, according to a press release by the Central Government of India on 10th September 2009, the Cabinet, Govt. of India has given approval of amendment of the bye-laws of the Indian Medical Council in which there is inclusion of article 2, 3, 8, 9, 17, in the bye-laws of so called Sorig under the Indian Medical Council. In November 2009, the above matter will be put before the Indian Parliament for approval and support for the amendment after which a decision will be taken. In some recent Indian newspapers Sowa Rigpa is considered a kind of Himalayan

Medicine and Amchi System of Medicine and calling it with different new names. Despite use of such new labels CCTM believes and hopes that this unique Tibetan cultural heritage with its ancient history as its witness can achieve its aspiration for recognition under Indian legal system.

Visit of CCTM Executive Members to Chagpori Tibetan Medical Institute for Inspection and Accreditation.

On 30th September, 2006 Chagpori Tibetan Medical Institute was provided with a temporary registration certificate for a period of three years under the CCTM bye-law (rules and guidelines) Section 2 of 10th clause. At the end of the allotted time period with request application received from the Chagpori Tibetan Medical College, as per the CCTM Guidelines for the registration of Medical Institutes, CCTM Executive Members form an inspection team and visited the Chagpori Medical Institute.

Dr. Dorjee Raptan Nasher, CCTM Chairman and Dr. Thokmay Paljor CCTM General Secretary, after their participation in the International Conference on Traditional Asian Medicine (ISTAM) in Bhutan reached Darjeeling on November 13, 2009. As per the guidelines of CCTM in forming an inspection team, Mr. Tenzin Tsepak, Darjeeling Welfare Officer, Mr. Deckyi wa Tsering Norbu, Secretary of Jamyang Tibetan Culture Preservation Centre were included in the inspection team. On November 14, 2009 the inspection team visited Chagpori Tibetan Medical Institute and inspected thoroughly the school classrooms, library, museum and hostels. In the meantime, each team member filled up the form with respect to his/her observation or inspection with regard to the institute's management, classroom management and other relevant aspects mentioned in the form and it was tabulated and a combined report is formed at the end. In the light of the report of the inspection team, CCTM Executive Members during its 12th Meeting discussed in details over the report and finally considering the present administration of the institute, and fulfilling the required facilities, yet needing some improvement, CCTM granted Chagpori Medical Institute's registration an extension of further 2 years from September 9, 2009 to September 8, 2011. The recognition of the Tibetan Medical College will be in

accordance with the guidelines and any institution in order to receive a full recognition of the sMen-pa Kachu-pa (equivalent to Bachelor of TMS) CCTM offers guidelines and suggestions and at the same time conduct inspections.

CCTM Representative Participates in two days Seminar in Ladakh



On the invitation received from Ladakh Society for Traditional Medicine, Leh-Ladakh to commemorate its 10 years anniversary from 21 – 26 July, 2009 and particularly to introduce Central Council of Tibetan Medicine (CCTM) and its guidelines or message to the Tibetan Medical Practitioners in Ladakh region, Dr. Nyima Tsering Lhunghang, Vice Chairman, CCTM participated in the event. On 21st July 2009, he introduced the origin of CCTM and its goals and objectives to over 60 doctors including few allopathic doctors. On the 22nd July 2009, Dr. Nyima Tsering Lhunghang talked about the benefits and shortcomings of natural herbs and plants for human health. On 23rd July 2009, he visited the clinic of Ladakh Society for Traditional Medicine, Leh-Ladakh, Nunnery Tibetan Medical College and Central Institute of Buddhist Studies on invitation and he emphasized on the promotion and development of Tibetan Traditional Medicine and also need for more interactions and cooperation between CCTM and other Tibetan Medical institutes and colleges. On 24th July, 2009, he met with the Ladakh Tibetan Chief Representative and discussed on the need for Local Health Committee and also requested him of his full support and cooperation for Tibetan Medical Doctors. In the meantime, he also met with the new CCTM coordinator in the region, Dr. Palmo and handed over the official appointed letter and oriented her about

her role as a CCTM coordinator. His Honorable Mr. Tsering Dorji, Minister of Leh Town chaired the concluding session of the event. In his presence, Dr. Nyima Tsering Lhunkhang, CCTM Vice Chairman once again introduced the CCTM and its noble aims and objectives and also presented His Excellency, Honorable Minister Leh, Mr. Tsering Dorji with small token before the session was closed.

7th International Conference on Asian Traditional Medicine

Dr. Dorjee Raptan Neshor, CCTM Chairman and Dr. Thokmay Paljor, CCTM General Secretary attended the 7th International Conference on Asian Traditional Medicine (ICTAM) from 7 – 11 September, 2009 held at Thimbu in Bhutan on receiving a special invitation from the organizing committee. The main topics for the discussions were Asian Traditional Medicine System and Practices, Problems and issues facing in the West while practicing Asian Medicine and overall promotion and development of the Asian Traditional Medicine System. A particular interest has shown toward Tibetan Medicine and discussions were carried out on numerous topics concerning Tibetan medicine. On 9th September, 2009, CCTM Chairman, Dr. Dorjee Raptan Neshor delivered a talk on research work on the efficacy of Tibetan Medicine for Cancer and on 10th September 2009, he delivered a speech on the establishment of Central Council of Tibetan Medicine (CCTM), its introduction and administration, the situation of Tibetan Medicine in exile and process



of achieving legal recognition of Tibetan Medicine and policies on Tibetan Medicine.

In this conference there are over 217 participants including doctors and other professionals from 30 different countries. There were 12 Tibetan Medical Practitioners from 5 different areas in Tibet, and another 22 Tibetan Medical Practitioners from India, Bhutan, Nepal and Europe putting a total of 34 Tibetan Medical Practitioners attended the conference.

On the evening of the 9th September 2009, CCTM organized a separate gathering for the Tibetan Medical Practitioners both from inside and outside Tibet to make acquaintance and introduced among doctors. CCTM Chairman extended his warm greetings and at the same time spelled out His Holiness the Dalai Lama's blessings and gratefulness in reviving the Tibetan Traditional Medical System in exile and its present development. He also introduced how CCTM had come into being and its various activities. All doctors



shared their own backgrounds and present professional designation one by one while having tea and snacks. The gathering was indeed a great success with lot of detail discussion among the doctors.

Health Talk



CCTM since its inception in 2004 till date has worked towards promoting health of common people by creating awareness through Health Talks on food habit and behavior, particularly on daily food habits and behaviors, introduction and prevention of epidemic and pandemic diseases, and etc. Recently during the visit of CCTM Representatives in Chagpori Medical Institute for its inspection, in the afternoon of 9th September, 2009 the institute's Medical students and staff members gathered in the hall to listen to the CCTM Representatives. In their Talks they stressed the gracious blessings of His Holiness the Dalai Lama in establishing Tibetan Medicine in exile, contribution of Tibetan Medicine in promoting people's health in the world. The talk further focused on the students in understanding the importance of Tibetan Medicine and taking care about their dietary and behavioral habits while studying.



On 15th September, 2009 they gave health talk to staff members and students of CST Darjeeling in their school hall. In their talk, they gave introduction on Tibetan Medicine and at the same time, stressed the importance of dietary and behavioral habits on a daily basis. The benefits of sticking to a healthy dietary and behavioral habits and also the harmful effects of deviating and then leading to different illnesses because of improper intake of food and misbehaviors. They also touched upon the importance of day to day health care of all individuals.

Since our previous Delhi CCTM Coordinator Dr. Tashi Tenzin was officially transferred to TMAI here at Dharamsala, we have requested Dr. Tenzin Deche Kartsang, Chief Medical Officer at TMAI branch clinic, Nizamuddin, New Delhi as CCTM new Coordinator in the area including Noida, Meerut, Ahmedabad and Orrisa to which he has very kindly agreed.

According to the CCTM bye-laws (guidelines) and particularly during the XIIth CCTM Executive Meeting, a resolution was reached to honor with a Yuthog Award to a distinguished Tibetan Medicine Practitioner for his/ her hard work, dedication and contribution in promoting Tibetan Medical tradition during the forthcoming 2nd National Conference on Tibetan Medicine in March 2010. The purpose of the Yuthog Award is to give recognition to Tibetan doctors who contributed and worked unrelentingly in promoting Tibetan medicine and also to inspire and encourage other Tibetan Medical Doctors to follow examples of the great achievers. Moreover, it also aims to present a brief biography of the Yuthog Award Achievers in the meeting for everyone's knowledge.

To confer this Yuthog Award, the Executive Members formed a 5-Member Committee and this committee held a Special Meeting for only one day, i.e., on 19th October, 2009. During the meeting, they have drafted and later finalized the Award's name and beginning date, number of awards and aims, criteria and requirements for selecting the candidates for the award. The Yuthog Award Committee later selected a list of qualified candidates for the award and handed over the list for final selection to the CCTM Executive Members and CCTM would officially announce the name of the Awardee at an appropriate time.

1. 2nd National Conference on Tibetan Medicine

The 2nd National Conference on Tibetan Medicine organized jointly by The Central Council of Tibetan Medicine (CCTM) and Tibetan Medical & Astrological Institute (TMAI) is to be held from 15 – 17 March 2010 at TMAI Hall, Dharamsala.
